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

Racial and Ethnic Minority Populations Are Growing at a Fast Pace






Percent of total U.S. population, all ages






Elders are a Larger Proportion of Oregon's Population Than in U.S. Overall






The Latino Population Has Grown Rapidly in Oregon





Prevalence of Chronic Health Conditions, Adults 65+




Functional Limitations by Nativity, Adults 65+


Barriers to Care among Latino Adults 65+

- Lack of transportation
- Lack of health insurance | eligibility for services | immigration status
- Healthcare system complexity
- Financial costs
- Cultural beliefs
- Poor patient –provider communication
- Limited English proficiency
- Availability of services | residential location
- Stigma and marginalization






Affordable Care Act

- 4+ million nonelderly Latino adults have gained health insurance coverage since 2012
- Included health promotion and wellness
- Increased funding to federally qualified health centers

Elders Are an Important Member of the Latino Family




- Elders are at center of social network

Latino Caregiving Families Have a Greater Burden of Care


Percent of Elders Receiving Care from Family



Hours of Weekly Care




Caregivers in High Burden Situations



Strategies for Improving Health for Aging Latinos

- Continue efforts to increase health insurance coverage through ACA expansion
- Strengthen financial programs for caregivers and families
- Design Long-Term Services and Supports that
 - Are culturally acceptable for Latino families | eliminate stigma
 - Use a multigenerational approach
 - Build communities' capacity to support caregivers
- Deliver clinical services that
 - Are family- and patient-centered
 - Include caregivers

The Caregiver Advise, Record, Enable (CARE) Act requires hospitals to:

- Provide your loved one the opportunity to designate a family caregiver.
- Inform you when your loved one is to be discharged to another facility or back home.
- Give you instruction or training of the medical tasks you will need to perform at home.
