- Supporting skill development and facilitate progress towards research independence through conversion to an R01 or similar award


Who can participate?

Anyone at OHSU or VA who has a career development award. No application necessary. This includes VA CDA, NIH K awards, plus career development awards available through professional groups or funding groups, e.g. American Heart Association, American Cancer Society. Program Benefits and Services

Education: to support development of competencies in clinical and translational research with specific skills

<u>Human Investigations Program (HIP)</u> allows participation through single class enrollment through completion of a certificate or Master of Clinical Research.

- Classes offered in biostatistics, proposal development, project management, and more.

<u>Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR)</u> training meets the requirements for all federal and non-federal career development grants.

Mentoring: activities to provide support during career development

<u>Scholars Quarterly Networking</u> events are informal gatherings to support and engage early-career investigators by providing opportunities to meet, engage in discussions, share knowledge beyond the mentor-mentee relationship, build a career development network across OHSU's disciplines and learn about career development opportunities and resources.

<u>Targeted information</u> dissemination of funding opportunities, seminars, workshops, conferences, and developments key to career development awardees.

Research Support: offering necessary services to advance research

<u>OCTRI services</u> offered include biostatistics, bioinformatics, clinical informatics, research compliance, IRB submission, voucher program, help with the NIH application process, CTRC support such as recruiting, research nursing, blood draws, or bionutrition. <u>Pilot Awards</u> to advance investigators research and career development through the Patient Clincial Interactions and Pathways to Independence awards.

Proposal Support: offering feedback at critical times in the development of research

<u>OCTRI Design Studio</u> is a monthly forum to present your research concept and proposal plans to a group of OHSU investigators.

 Ideal presentation times include at the time of proposing or implementing a career development award, or during development of your first independent application.

<u>CDA Library</u> access to a repository of successful examples of career development awards along with some reviews and resources. Contact <u>Melissa Mudd</u> to access the library.

<u>Proposal Development</u> HIP course where trainees develop a research hypothesis, specific aims, and research methods to answer a clinical question culminating in a grant proposal. This class can be taken as a non-degree student.
