## Voting Rights for People with IDD in Oregon

As of 2018, 54% of Oregonians with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) voted, or had the opportunity to vote, in a past election.

Although Oregon has one of the highest state percentages of people with IDD who vote, there are still many people with IDD who do not vote. Make sure your voice is heard and learn more about your right to vote below.
