

Conference Description:

With the goal of excellence in rural education in mind, this conference will address the special needs and concerns of professionals working with persons with HIV infection and AIDS in rural communities. Honored faculty will present current information and research regarding the AIDS epidemic, pathophysiology, treatment strategies, psychosocial, and emotional components of the illness. Challenges of caring for persons with AIDS and their families living in the rural setting will be explored both personally and professionally.

Conference Objectives:

This educational offering will enable the participant to better:

- 1. Comprehend the pathophysiology of HIV infection and AIDS.
- 2. Describe current technologies, procedures and treatment strategies being used in the care of persons with HIV infection and AIDS.
- Identify the approaches for preventing and managing complications of AIDS care including early intervention strategies for rural providers.
- Describe the emotional impact of AIDS from the patient's perspective and related therapeutic implications.
- Enhance clinical and psychosocial assessment skills in the care of the AIDS patient and family living in the rural setting and institute appropriate interventions.
- 6. Understand the historical response to epidemics, effects on health policy, and the special needs and concerns of providers and employers in the rural community regarding the AIDS epidemic.
- 7. Exchange ideas and resources and discuss common concerns with colleagues.






