Moving to adult health care at age 18

Be prepared with the information you need

It can be complicated moving from pediatric to adult health care. That transition usually takes place at age 18. If your youth's doctors don't bring up the subject of moving to new health care providers by age 16 or 17, you can start the conversation with five short questions.
