OHSU-formatted CV

- Most important item used for decisions about promotion, funding, jobseeking, and more
- Your complete academic record you should keep it up to date continuously
- Akin to a medical record, if you don't document it, you didn't do it

NIH biosketch

- Obviously important for grant proposals
- But also a shorter and more succinct CV
