


# Research Fellowship

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Two-year fellowship program in Emergency Medicine research with the Oregon Health & Science University Center for Policy and Research in Emergency Medicine (CPR-EM) combines health services and clinical research, and didactic studies in research methods and biostatistics.



## Introduction

Fellows select research projects tailored to their individual interests within the broad range of health services and clinical research. The Research Fellowship integrates coursework resulting in the completion of a Master of Clinical Research (MCR) or a Master of Public Health (MPH) in Epidemiology and Biostatistics. Applicants who already hold an advanced research degree will develop a customized curriculum to expand on their research skills and content expertise.

Fellows will hold faculty appointments in the Oregon Health & Science University Department of Emergency Medicine. Full benefits, a competitive salary, travel funds, and tuition support are included. Candidates must be board-prepared or board-certified in Emergency Medicine.

They should have a demonstrated interest in health services or clinical research and a commitment to a career in academic Emergency Medicine.

## Goals & Objectives

The purpose of the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) Emergency Medicine Research Fellowship Program is to train clinician-scientists who will become leaders in emergency care research. This will be achieved by:

- Working with each fellow to develop a program that addresses her or his professional goals in emergency care research.
- Formal training in research methodology through a combination of didactic study and intensive individual mentorship.
- Providing experience in project management, manuscript writing, grant writing and grant submission.
- Integrating the fellows into the activities of an academic department of Emergency Medicine in order to provide understanding of the career track of an academic Emergency Physician.
