June was a busy month for DMICE proposal submission. The EPC, in particular, deserves an Endurance Award for submitting eight task order proposals to AHRQ in ten days between June 10th to June 20th. In addition, Dr. David Dorr submitted an RO1 proposal, Dr. Lisa Karstens submitted an R03 proposal, and Dr. Steven Bedrick submitted an RO1 renewal proposal, all to NIH.
