OHSU Graduate Medical Education (GME) Self-Guided OHSU Campus Tour

(Marquam Hill and South Waterfront)

★ Please note that many locations will have limited public access/badge access only, including hospital and clinic locations.

** <u>Emergency Department:</u> The OHSU and Doernbecher Children's Hospital Emergency departments are located in Hatfield Research Center on Marquam Hill. Emergency services are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Med students, residents and fellows from many programs complete their ED rotations here. Situated on a hill, the Emergency Department's street entrance is located on Sam Jackson Park Road and is the 8th Floor of the hospital.

<u>Information & Admitting Desk:</u> The OHSU Hospital Information & Admitting Desk is located on the 9th floor, in the hospital lobby. Hospital visitors can connect for directions on campus, dining options, waiting areas, and can check in for surgery here or request transportation support. The desk is staffed during daytime and evening hours. (M-F, 530a-9p; S-S 9a-730p; Holidays 9a-730p)

Treasures Gift Shop and It's All Good Health Food Store: In the hospital lobby, you will find both the *Treasures Gift Shop* with an array of gifts and just a few steps away, you will arrive to the *It's All Good @ OHSU* health food store. When you shop here, you'll find healthful products that are nutrient dense, contain heart healthy fats, minimize sugar and salt content, organic, and are sourced in a way that give preference to local or fair-trade producers.

POHSU-VAMC Skybridge: Just beyond the health food store in the main hospital lobby, there will be the option to go left to the Skybridge that leads to the Portland VAMC or right to Doernbecher Children's Hospital. Head left for a view of the city down the longest suspension bridge of its type in North America at 660 feet long. Continue to the VAMC if interested, or head back toward the hospital lobby.

Portland VAMC: The Portland Veteran Affairs Medical Center partners with many residency programs on campus and shares research, training, staff, clinician educators and researchers. When you exit the Skybridge at the VA, you will be on the 2nd Floor. If you head to the first floor there is a VA store, food and coffee options. Building 100 is the education wing and offers conference space to some GME programs.

Doernbecher Children's Hospital: Doernbecher Children's Hospital's main building is located on Marquam Hill off SW Campus Drive. The Doernbecher Hospital building is connected to the main OHSU Hospital. Follow signs from the hospital admitting desk and past the gift shop to get to Doernbecher (or if returning from the Skybridge, follow the signs to DCH). The walkway on the 9th floor of DCH provided a view of the Skybridge and the city of Portland on a clear day. Doernbecher provides comprehensive pediatric care for newborns through young adults. Take the Kangaroo elevators to the 7th Floor Pediatric Clinics and see bright murals, fish tanks, colorful seating, and books for reading. The DCH Pharmacy is also located on this floor as an added benefit for families with children to minimize travel throughout the hospital. Next, head to the main lobby of DCH to grab a cup of coffee or snacks at Starbuck's. There is also an information desk in the lobby and the Tom Sargent Safety Center where you can get safety resources and can purchase discounted safety supplies including helmets, and child-proofing supplies. If you exit from the DCH lobby outside, across the street you will find the OHSU Student Center, with resources available to residents and fellows as well.

OHSU Student Center: Located on SW Campus Drive in the "canyon" steps away from the DCH lobby exit, the Student Center is a place for current OHSU students, GME residents and fellows, as well as employees of OHSU, to gather, relax, decompress or exercise. The Student Center offers a variety of social and cultural activities, and the staff is dedicated to working closely with the OHSU community to conduct innovative and engaging programs. Amenities include swimming pool and hot tub, gymnasium, wellness room, media room, nucleus lounge, art showcase and piano, computer and study room. Head back to the lobby of DCH for your next destination.

Casey Eye Institute & Elks Children's Eye Clinic: If you are interested in Ophthalmology residency or fellowships, this is a good time to detour and take a walk down the hill from the DCH lobby to the Casey Eye buildings. The Casey Eye Institute and Elks Children's Eye Clinic buildings on Marquam Hill are the main locations for the Institute's eye health services and research. They are located at the intersection of SW Terwilliger Blvd and Campus Drive. Casey Eye Institute also provides services at the Center for Health & Healing in the South Waterfront district at the base of the Portland Tram. They have other locations in Washington State. Head back up the hill to the lobby of DCH for your next destination.

Vey Conference Center: The Vey Conference Center and Marion L. Miller Auditorium are on the 11th floor of Doernbecher Children's Hospital. You are not able to access this location from the Kangaroo elevators, but if you head to the 10th floor, then continue down the hall away from OHSU hospital, there is a cylindrical stairwell (or elevator) that will take you to the 11th floor conference center. Residency programs may hold grand rounds in this space. Head back to the 9th Floor and follow signs back to OHSU Hospital. Once back in the main lobby, take a trip to the 3rd Floor of the hospital and visit the main OHSU cafeteria.

OHSU 3rd Floor Cafeteria: OHSU's largest full-service café is open 24/7 and serves a wide variety of hot and cold foods, including a soup and salad bar, grab and go options and multiple hot entrees with daily special menus. If you need access to food while in hospital overnight, this is where you can go for a great selection. Head back to the main lobby on the 9th Floor and head for the Aerial Tram.

Kohler Pavilion & the Portland Aerial Tram: From the main lobby on the 9th Floor, you will follow signage to the Tram. This will lead you into the Kohler Pavilion, where you will find an information desk, a waiting area with amazing views and the upper terminal tram platform. The ride down is free always, but the return trip requires a ticket. Employees use their badge to access the tram. The tram cabins travel 3,300 linear feet from the hill to the south waterfront. The trip lasts approximately 4 minutes and rises 500 feet during the trip. Capacity is set at 79 people and it is load and go, so there is always another on the way. Check schedule as it varies by day.

If you want to skip the South Waterfront tour, please go to Physician's Pavilion below and continue the tour on Marquam Hill.

South Waterfront: The South Waterfront is a transportation hub to downtown Portland and to and from Marquam Hill. It connects with the light rail, TriMet bus system, Portland Streetcar and is walkable to nearby restaurants, housing and hotels.

Go by Bike: Bike Valet at the Tram: At the base of the tram, there is a bike valet service. Go by Bike operates the largest bike valet in North America, parking over 100,000 bikes a year. They also offer same day bike repair service. Many trainees bike to the tram, and head up to the hill to complete their residency training. They also offer a bike share program on the south waterfront. There are also commuting incentives when you commute by bike.

The South Waterfront has a lot to offer to access the city and additional OHSU healthcare services. The Centers for Health & Healing Buildings 1 & 2 are located at the base of the tram and many clinics and short stay surgeries occur here. There is a large atrium in CHH1 with coffee and the Daily Café. Take a trip on the elevators to explore clinic locations in your specialty of choice.

**Rood Family Pavilion: Across the street from CHH2, is the Rood Family Pavilion. This pavilion is run in partnership with the Ronald McDonald House Charities of Oregon & SW Washington and provides families a place to stay when their loved ones are in the hospital and they live outside the metro area. There are 38 suites for pediatric patients and families and 38 suites for adult patients and their families.

** Knight Cancer Research Building, Robertson Life Sciences Building and OHSU Skourtes Tower at RLSB:

A quick walk or pedicab ride away, the KCRB is dedicated to ending cancer as we know it. This space brings together people from different scientific disciplines to accelerate research progress. The RLSB is home to health and science education and research and is a collaboration between OHSU, Oregon State University and Portland State University. The OHSU Skourtes Tower at the Robertson Collaborative Life Sciences Building is the hub for education including lecture halls, classrooms, labs, specialty research centers, offices, simulation centers and a state-of-the-art facility for the OHSU School of Dentistry.

Physician's Pavilion: Take the tram back up to the main campus and exit into Kohler Pavilion, continue in a straight path and walk outside. Take the ramp or stairs to the street level (you will be able to see the Emergency Department from the street up to the left. Cross Sam Jackson Park Road and head up the slight hill to the Physician's Pavilion. This is the location of the Outpatient Pharmacy and many primary care and specialty clinics. The main outpatient phlebotomy lab is located on the 3rd floor, near the skybridge to Sam Jackson Hall. If you exit at the first floor and head to the right, you will be headed toward Multnomah Pavilion.

Multnomah Pavilion: Multnomah Pavilion was built in 1923 as Multnomah County Hospital, and is located behind Physicians Pavilion and Sam Jackson Hall. Occupational Health is located on the 2nd floor of Multnomah Pavilion (street level entry). If you head downstairs, you can navigate to the back of the building and exit into the Emma Jones Hall parking lot.

Emma Jones Hall: Emma Jones Hall (EJH) is behind Multnomah Pavilion - it's not visible from any of the main roads. Emma Jones Hall is home to academic offices primarily in Family Medicine. Education and residency space is here for the OHSU Family Medicine program. As you head toward Emma Jones Hall, you will see Shriner's Children's Hospital on the right. Head back into Multnomah Pavilion on the first floor, and exit out the front door on the 2nd floor.

Sam Jackson Hall: Sam Jackson Hall is across from both the Physician's Pavilion and the OHSU Hospital, just steps away from the main OHSU Hospital drop-off entrance. It is connected to Physicians Pavilion through a sky bridge on the 3rd floor and to the OHSU Hospital through a sky bridge that extends over SW Sam Jackson Park Road. It connects from the 3rd floor in Sam Jackson Hall to the 11th floor of OHSU Hospital. The basement entrance to the Sam Jackson Hall is on Sam Jackson Park Road. The 3rd Floor of Sam Jackson Hall houses a resident lounge, locker room and call rooms

with lactation rooms nearby (and throughout campus). OHSU is made up of a lot of interconnected buildings. If you stay on the 3rd floor and take a left before entering Multnomah Pavilion, you can weave through a research building atrium and into Mackenzie Hall. You can also exit on the 1st Floor of Sam Jackson Hall and head up the hill (there is short term paid parking along the ramp up to Mackenzie Hall). Mac Hall will be at the top of the ramp on the right.

Mackenzie Hall: Mackenzie Hall, often abbreviated to Mac Hall, is a multipurpose building with administrative offices, laboratories, and classrooms. It's located near the large fountain (top of the ramp) and the central GME administrative offices are located on the 5th Floor. Residency programs have offices within their home department. Mackenzie Hall is home to the Office of the Dean of the School of Medicine and the Mac Hall Café & Espresso. If you enter following the 3rd floor of Sam Jackson Hall, you will end up on the 1st Floor of Mac Hall. If you walk up the ramp to the fountain, you will enter on the 2nd Floor. To access the Café from the 2nd Floor, take an elevator down to the 1st Floor, take a left out of the elevator, pass through a doorway and turn left. It will be on the left as you head down the hall. If you enter from the 3rd floor of Sam Jackson Hall, you will be coming from the opposite direction, will pass Mac Hall Café. Take a right through the open doorway, then continue to the elevator to the 2nd Floor to exit, or head up to 5 to see the GME Office.

The Mackenzie Hall Fountain: The Alumni Fountain was installed on August 29, 1963. The three-ton bronze fountain stands five feet high and 10 feet in diameter and was designed by architect Lewis Crutcher. The fountain is a gathering space on campus for planned and unplanned occasions, including lunch and studying. From late spring to early fall, the OHSU Farmer's Market sits in the space surrounding the fountain.

OHSU Auditorium: The OHSU Auditorium is used for large events, many of which are open to the public. The Auditorium is located near the Mackenzie Hall fountain, and was the first library building on the campus of the University of Oregon Medical School (now OHSU). It is sometimes referred to as the Old Library and offers several rooms for conferences and meeting spaces.

VirtuOHSU: Head down the stairs between the OHSU Auditorium and Mac Hall and weave around the large half head statue to the Richard T. Jones Hall for Basic Medical Sciences. Here you will find the VirtuOHSU Simulation and Surgical Training Center that provides opportunities for learners to practice surgical skills and simulation activities. To see inside the Center, visit A Tour of OHSU and go to video location 14:32. Learners at OHSU share this space. From RJH, you can see the outdoor seating area from Mac Hall Café. This is a place where people come to gather.

BICC/Library: As you make your way back to the fountain, head to the top of the ramp and cross over the skybridge connected to the OHSU Library. Commonly referred to as "the BICC," the Biomedical Information Communications Center houses the OHSU Library. It's also home to several academic departments. The BICC Gallery is located on the 1st Floor of the BICC and is a large open space with adjoining meeting and classrooms. The library and resources are on the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Floors. Street level of the BICC is the 2nd Floor, where you can exit to a walkway in the back to parking lots, or to the front on Sam Jackson Park Road near the Emergency Department. The BICC is not connected to the OHSU Hospital. Learn more about the OHSU Library.

Hatfield Research Center: As you walk down the slight hill toward OHSU Hospital before finishing your tour, you can enter the Hatfield Research Center on the 9th Floor just above the Emergency Department and enjoy a coffee drink or food at the Plaza Café. The long hall parallel to Sam Jackson Park Road takes you right back to the Hospital Lobby and Admitting Desk.

4T Trail System: The 4T Trail System: Trail, Tram, Trolley, Train. Explore Portland landmarks on the 4T trail that runs through OHSU to the Tram down to the South Waterfront. Please visit the website to make sure the trail is open 4T Trail Website or check out this video: 4T Trail Overview Video
