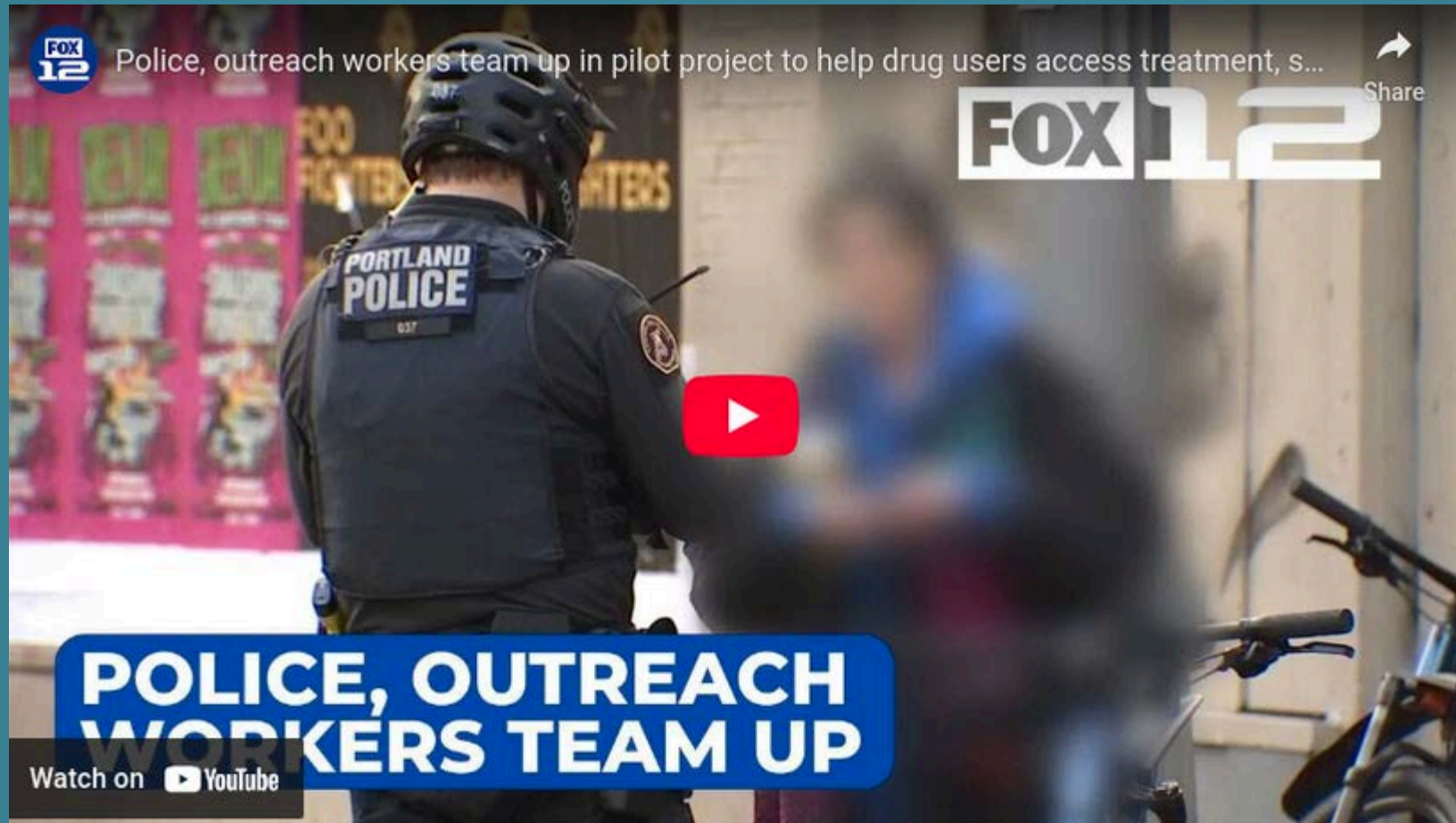

About the Project

Addiction recovery providers and Portland-area law enforcement are **teaming up to save lives** to help some of our community's most vulnerable citizens: those who are living outside, struggling with addiction, and suffering from unmet behavioral health needs.

Pilot events have successfully been completed in the downtown Portland area, in partnership with

- **Portland Police Central NRT Bike Squad, CHAT, and PSR**
- **advocacy coalition Health Justice Recovery Alliance (HJRA),**
- **addiction service providers**, including MHAAO peer program staff from the BHRC, BHRC Van and Outreach teams, JOHS Navigation Team, the Prime+ Program, and other
- **community providers**, such as Recovery Works NW, Miracles, Painted horse recovery, CCC, NW Instituto Latino, and Transcending hope.

Community Providers played vital roles in staffing each pilot with outreach teams that were **culturally and linguistically specific** in order to help secure emergency shelter, detox, and treatment beds for those who needed help.

This project gives Police a **new tool** to connect people to lifesaving interventions:

- ✓ Detox
- ✓ Addiction Treatment
- ✓ Shelter
- ✓ Basic needs referrals
- ✓ Mental health care
- ✓ Medical care
- ✓ Community supports

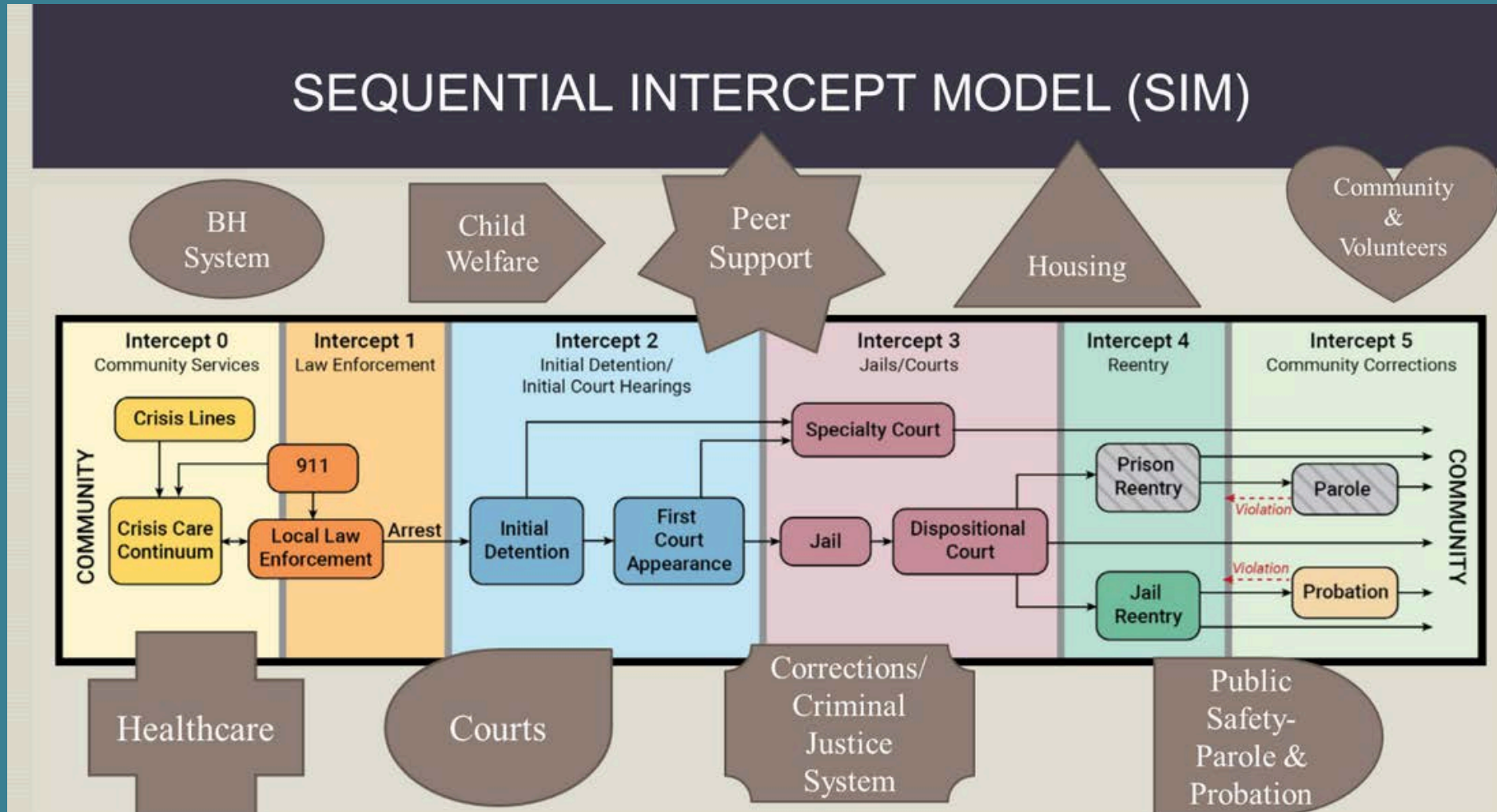

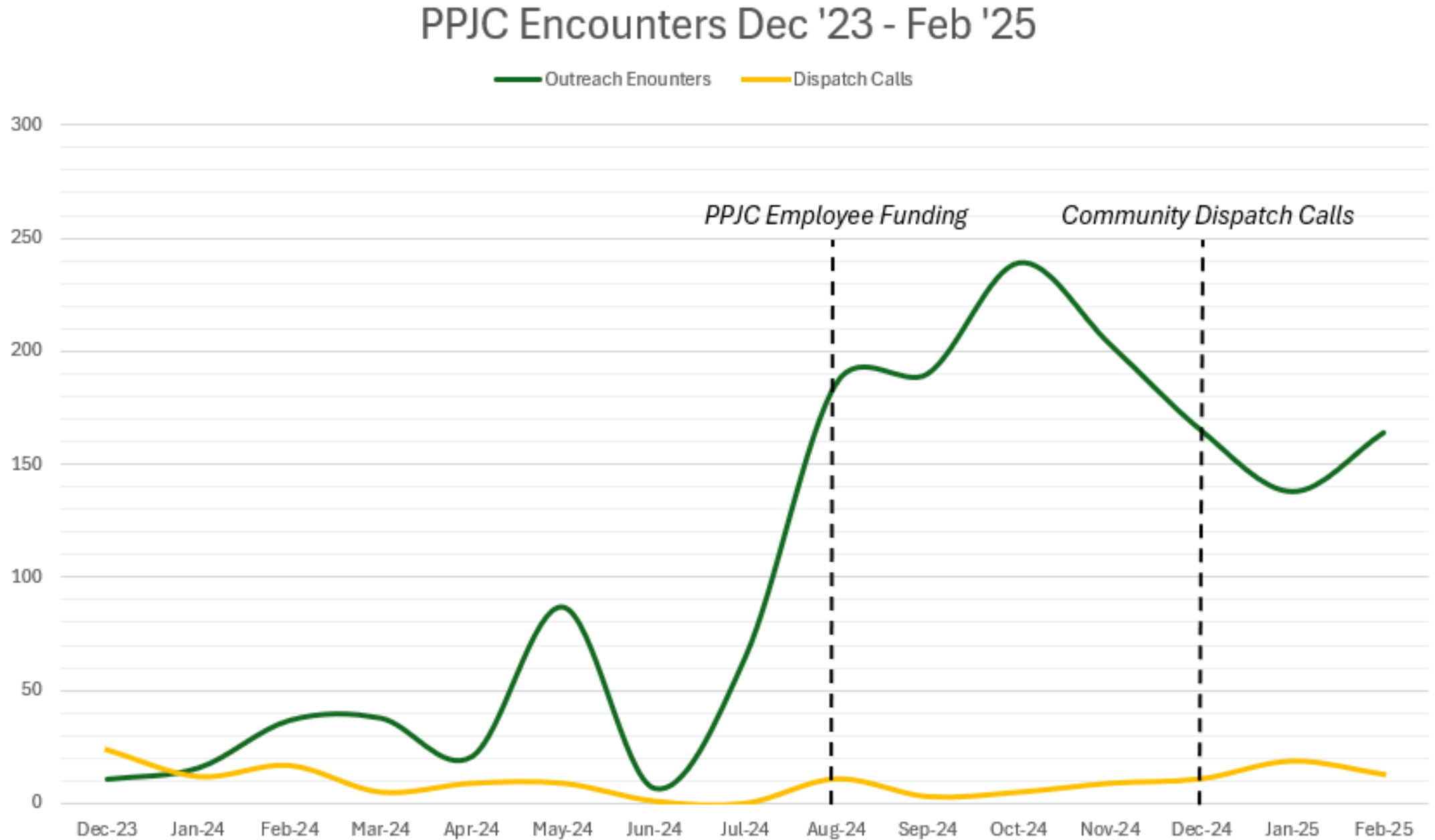

Sequential Intercept Model



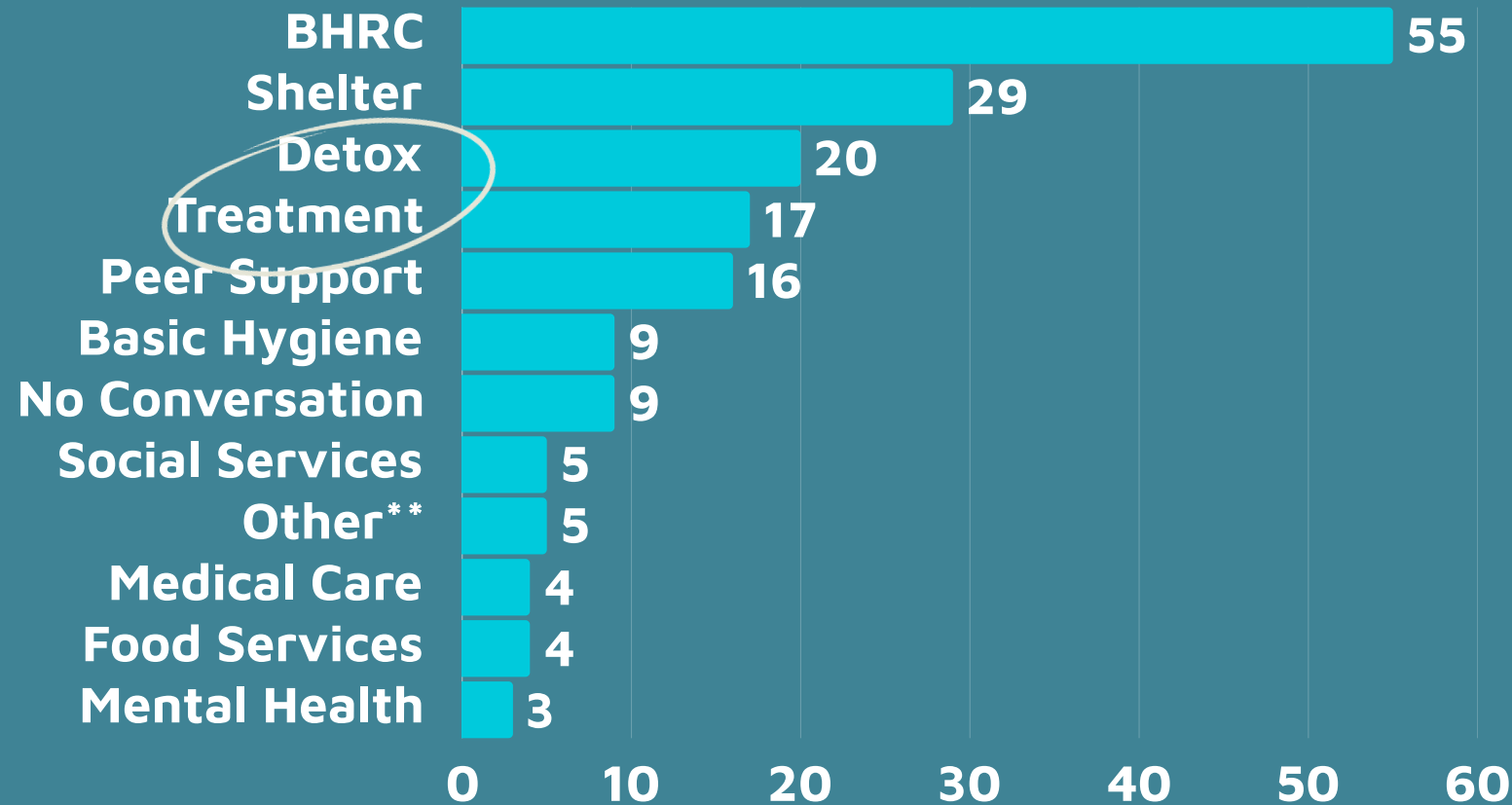
Mobile Response Snapshot



Top Services Requested

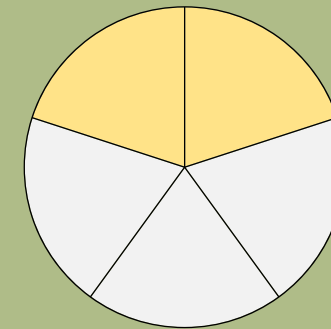

**Includes but not limited to animal, phone, couples, veterans services



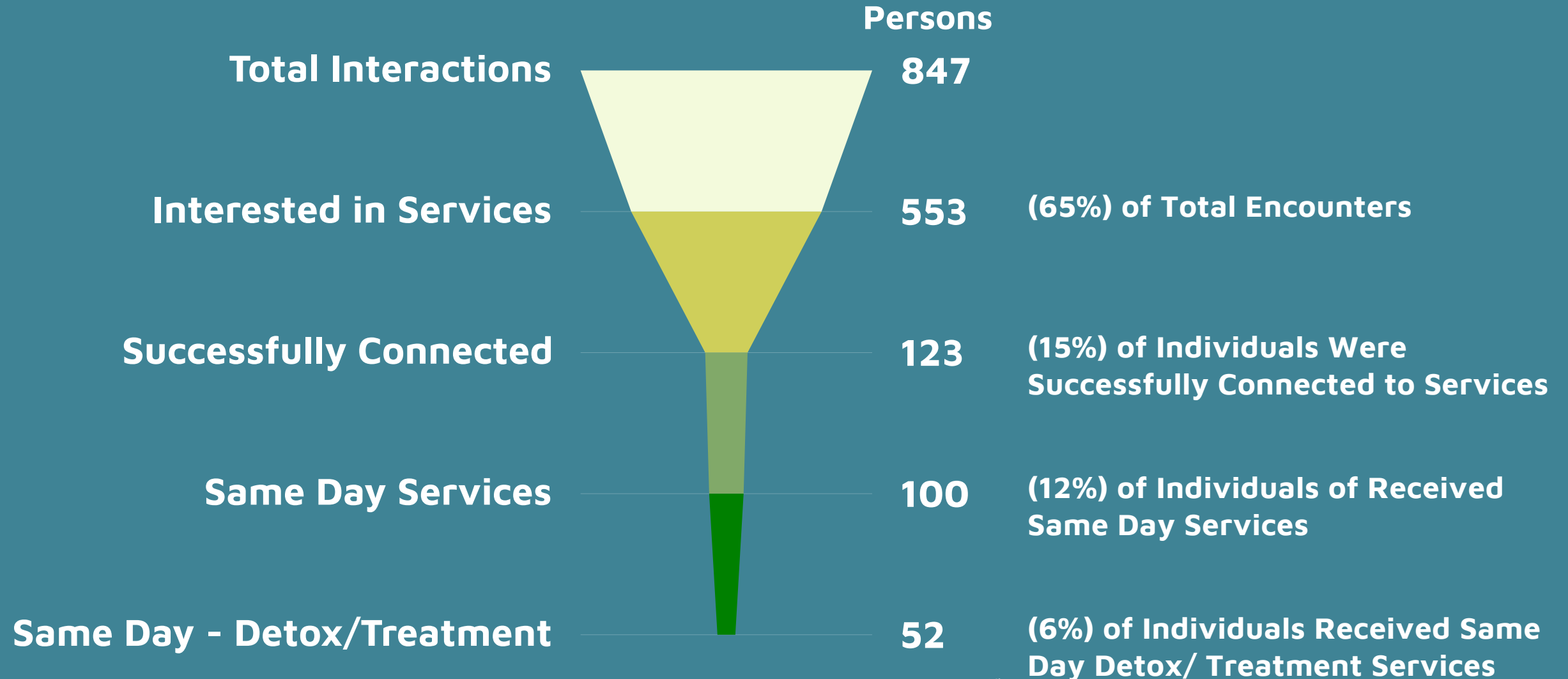
Detox or Treatment
